Class 1 are currently leading the way with an average number of reads of child of 53 nights! They are well on the way to receiving their 300 nights bookmark at the end of the year.

Please continue to log all reading that your child does at home, whether it be a wordless picture book or a newspaper article! All reading counts. Even when you have read aloud to your child at bedtime!

And please don't feel that you have to log the reading with your child at bedtime – there are options on the app to record the reading at any time and you can back date too. This is at the top of the screen where it asks "When did you read?" By clicking on the pencil icon, you can change the date.
